## OLV PARISH FESTIVAL IS MAY 16, 17, AND 18

Our annual OLV Festival is a fun time for the parish community to come together and enjoy the festival fun. To help the logistics run as smoothly as possible, there are some changes with our arrival and dismissal procedures during the week of the festival. Please share this information with anyone who is helping you with carpool the week of the festival. THANK YOU IN ADVANCE FOR YOUR PATIENCE AND COOPERATION WITH THE PARKING AND DISMISSAL. We will do all we can to help this to run as smoothly and efficiently as possible.

- MORNING CARPOOL: We'd like ALL MORNING carpools (PK-8) to drop off their students in the North Lot (behind church) May 13th-May 16th.
- PRESCHOOL/KINDERGARTEN HALF DAY STUDENTS: Parents will need to park in the North Lot (behind Church) and walk to the area where you currently pick students up.

#### - AFTERNOON CARPOOL - NORTH LOT:

We are going to dismiss all students kindergarten through grade 8 from the North Lot (behind church).

#### - PRESCHOOL CARPOOLS:

There is a change in where you will be picking students up. If you have a PRESCHOOLER ONLY, you need to pull into the driveway between church and the Convocation Center and pull through the lane in front of church. Preschool aides will bring your child to you. Once you have your child, please pull forward and exit the driveway in front of you to your left.

If you have a preschooler and other grade students in your carpool. You need to park in the NORTH LOT. Please pick up your preschoolers from CHURCH and walk them back to your car in the NORTH LOT and wait for the rest of your K-8 students.

The North Lot will be full. Please help to make this work by pulling up close to the car in front of you. Additional staff will be in the parking lot to add additional parking lines.

- SCHOOL AND CHURCH VISITORS: If you are visiting the school, church, or parish office during the week of the festival between 8 am and 2:30 pm, please park in the North Lot behind the church. If you are visiting between 2:30 pm and 3:15 pm, once the rides and/or tents are assembled, please park in the cemetery loop.
- AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM: If you are picking up your children from the After School Program during the
  week before the festival, once the booths are set up, please park in the cemetery loop or behind church
  when picking up your children. There will be NO After School Program for any students on Friday,
  May 16th.
- School is not in session on May 19th to allow for festival clean-up.
- Once again we are asking families/students to donate Pringles cans, any flavor, for the Ring Toss Booth. Please turn in can(s) between April 28th-May 9th. Students who participate will receive an out of uniform pass to be used on May 9th.
